### ACCESSIBILITY

#### Accessibility by public transport

#### Parking

- Underground parking at Kastner & Öhler department store, directly opposite (note: from the department store you have to cross 2 pavements and a road with tram tracks)
- 2 designated disabled parking spaces at Kaiser-Franz-Josef-Kai, at level of house no. 18, approx. 200 m away

### ACCESS AND ENTRANCE

- In the warm time of year, all the entrances to the restaurant are open. The main entrance is accessible (1st entrance arriving from the Hauptplatz).
- Access via pavement, **paving stones** in front of the entrance
- 85 cm long **ramp** to the entrance door with **approx. 12 % incline**
- Turning circle of 150 cm available at the beginning and end of the ramp
- Surface covering of the ramp = dust control mat, non-slip
- Hinged door made of glass **not marked**
- Lever handle on the outside, anti-panic handle on the inside
- Clear door width 110 cm

**ENTRANCE AND INTERIOR AREA**

- Space between tables and chairs rather cramped
- Due to a **step**, a small area at the far end of the restaurant is not accessible to disabled persons
- Flooring suitable for wheelchairs
- Chairs and tables movable
- Tables: Upper edge 75 cm, lower edge 72 cm, under-table wheelchair access to a depth of 36 cm
- All tables with centre table leg, table top 80 x 80 cm

**TOILET**

The toilets belong to the History Museum and are only accessible via the courtyard (exit again at the main entrance and then left). Access not marked.

**Access**

- Courtyard with historical paving, **not easy for wheelchairs**
- Grating in front of the access to the WCs (**1 cm threshold**)
- Access to the WCs **not marked**
- 1st access door: Hinged door made of glass (**not sufficiently marked**), **not easy to open**, clear door width 90 cm, no door stop, vertical bar handle
- 2nd access door: Hinged door with lever handle, clear door width 85 cm, no door stop



Access to WC

**WC**

- Separate marked, accessible toilet
- Room size 230 x 155 cm, turning circle of 150 cm just provided
- WC door: Hinged door with lever handle, clear door width 85 cm, no door stop
- WC height 47 cm
- WC accessible from the left (90 cm space)
- **Just one handrail** (on right, angled grab bar, 73 cm height)
- Paper reachable when sitting
- Washbasin at a height of 80 cm, small and no under-basin wheelchair access
- Mirror: **Lower edge 130 cm** (standard max. 95 cm)
- Emergency bell available (button)
